SUMMER 2018: TERM A (July 16 – August 26)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

The Pentateuch (BS107)

A study of the first five books of the Bible. A special emphasis will be given to creation, the seed of Christ, and the covenant. This study will provide a true understanding of the plan of God for man.

Tabernacle & Priesthood (TH409)

This course will cover the structure and symbolism of Israel's tabernacle and the priesthood. Special emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament reality and meaning, providing a vivid revelation of Christ and his finished work.

Masters Level Courses

Personal Spiritual Development (PM516)

This course provides an in-depth, direct study concerning the personal spiritual development of the believer as revealed in the Word of God. Close attention is given to commitment, dedication, and personal holiness in lifestyle and conduct. Students will learn the importance of a life of intimacy with God.

The Servant Leader (LD560)

The foundation of servant leadership is deeply-rooted in Scripture and modeled by Jesus Christ and early church leaders. This course will discover and examine Biblical principles of leadership in comparison to both traditional and contemporary secular leadership theory and skills. Emphasis will be placed upon Scriptural integrity in effectively critiquing leadership roles, as well as the influence of secular leadership models upon traditional and contemporary ministry.

SUMMER 2018: TERM B (August 6 – September 16)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

The Minor Prophets (BS404)

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of the twelve prophets from Hosea to Malachi. This study will examine the writer, historical background, and the purpose and theme of each book.

Face to Face with God (TH407) NEW ONLINE COURSE

It is essential that genuine Christian experience include a personal spiritual encounter with God Himself. This course will encourage students to seek to know the Lord without measure and to experience the manifest presence of God.

Christ in the Seven Feasts (TH417)

The feasts of Israel vividly present the prophetic promise of the restoration of all things in their ultimate fulfillment in Jesus Christ under the New Covenant. In types and shadows God orchestrated His complete plan of man's redemption.

Masters Level Courses

Applied Theology (TH507) NEW ONLINE COURSE

A study of the practice of theology; this course will examine the theology and practice of the believer's personal encounter and relationship with God.

The Typology of the Feasts (TH537)

This course will provide an exploration of the seven Feasts of the Lord (Leviticus 23:1-44) and their fulfillment in Jesus Christ. Emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament fulfillment.

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

A Study of the Book of Acts (BS104)

An exciting study of the powerful work of the Holy Spirit through believers to establish the kingdom of God revealing the origin and development of the New Testament church.

Theology I: A Study of God (TH304)

A study of the divine nature, character, and attributes of God, this course will provide a deeper understanding of God, and an enhanced faith in Him.

Masters Level Courses

The Competent Leader (LD501)

This course will explore Biblical guidelines for leadership, the qualifications of spiritual leaders, and the importance of being led by the Spirit and walking in close fellowship with God. It will examine the lives of several leaders throughout the Bible, studying both their successes and failures, and understanding the importance of genuine character in the men and women whom God will raise up to fulfill His call today.

Theology Proper (TH514)

This course will address what the Scriptures teach about God, providing a strong theological context into which the practice of one's faith exists.
