WINTER 2019: TERM A (January 7 – February 17)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

A Study of James (BS106)

James is one of the most direct and practical writers of the New Testament, providing a valuable understanding of the problems facing many of the early Jewish believers. This detailed and in-depth study will explore the background, purpose, and practical application of this powerful and interesting book, and will leave the student with a renewed faith in our Lord.

Major Prophets I: Isaiah & Jeremiah (BS303)

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Lamentations. This study will examine the writer, the theme, and purpose of the writings, as well as their methods of ministry.

Leadership for Renewal (LD408)

Using Scriptural mandate and historical ecclesiastical example, this course will examine the Biblical nature and fundamentals of spiritual renewal. With this emphasis, the Christian leader will be challenged to provide effective leadership for spiritual reform and renewal within the body of Christ.

Masters Level Courses

A Study of Isaiah & Jeremiah (BS513)

This course will examine the writer, the date and time of the writing, and the theme and purpose of the books of Isaiah & Jeremiah.

The Leader and Renewal (LD508)

With emphasis on the need for personal spiritual renewal and genuine Spirit-led leadership, the primary objective of this course will be to instill confidence in Christ, the Gospel, and the ministry. Relying on the Biblical mandate and historical examples of spiritual reform, students will discover the importance of responsibility, accountability, integrity in ministry, and the absolute necessity of Spirit-led leadership.

WINTER 2019: TERM B (January 28 – March 10)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

Marriage & Family I (PM102)

A practical and in-depth study of biblical guidelines concerning marriage and the family. Upon completion, participants should have an understanding of marriage as ordained by God, as well as positive guidelines for developing a happy and successful Christian home.

Grace & Law (TH307)

A Scriptural examination of grace and law. This course will contrast grace and law and seek to enhance the student's understanding and knowledge of what is meant by salvation by grace through faith in Christ

Masters Level Courses

General Epistles (BS501)

A study of the General Epistles: Hebrews, James, 1-2 Peter, 1-3 John, and Jude. Emphasis will be placed upon the background and purpose of each book, as well as the practical aspect of each. This study will examine the problems these epistles seek to correct, examining the methods used and how each book applies to us today.

A Study of Galatians (TH517)

This message of justification by faith has often been misunderstood and distorted by those who possess an incorrect understanding of Scripture, or an alternate agenda (Gal. 1:9). Upon completion of this course, students should have a good understanding of the Scriptural doctrine of justification by faith and an awareness of the challenges facing the believer today.

WINTER 2019: TERM C (February 25 – April 7)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

Biblical Principles of Leadership I (PM101)

A study of the biblical principles of leadership as revealed in the Word of God. We will discover the importance of integrity in character and ministry, being led by the Spirit, and walking in the fullness of your calling.

Intro to Hermeneutics: How to Study the Bible (PH403)

A study of the methods of biblical interpretation; this course teaches the student the principles of rightly dividing the Word of Truth.

Hearing God (TH424) NEW ONLINE COURSE

This course will examine what it means to walk with God in a deep and personal way. Emphasis will be placed on the ability of the believer to walk in intimate communication with God.

Masters Level Courses

Biblical Hermeneutics (PH503)

This course is designed to help equip students and ministers with the tools to increase their skill in interpreting, teaching, and preaching the Word of God. The objective of the course is to prepare men and women who are faithful to the biblical text in their interpretation and ministry.

Dynamic Theology (TH524) NEW ONLINE COURSE

This course will seek to establish that it is God's desire and intention to communicate with His people on a personal level. Students will explore the Scriptures, examining not only the Biblical precedence, but also the practical blessing, of living a life of intimacy with God.

WINTER 2019: TERM D (March 18 – April 28)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

Old Testament Survey (BS203)

An examination of each book of the Old Testament from Genesis to Malachi. The date, authorship, purpose, and history behind each book will be discussed, and particular attention given to the writings of the prophets.

The Doctrine of Man (TH419)

Understanding the nature, fall, and redemption of man is a very important part of any systematic study of theology. Particular attention will be given to the fall of man and salvation through the finished work of Christ. Upon completion, students should have a deeper understanding of the origin, nature, purpose, and destiny of man.

Masters Level Courses

Applied Theology: Face to Face with God (TH507)

A study of the practice of theology; this course will examine the theology and practice of the believer's personal encounter and relationship with God.

Theology of Man (TH503)

Theological Anthropology: This course will examine the doctrine of man; his origin, nature, purpose, and destiny.
