WINTER 2020: TERM A (January 6 – February 16)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

Marriage & Family I (PM102)

A practical and in-depth study of biblical guidelines concerning marriage and the family. Upon completion, participants should have an understanding of marriage as ordained by God, as well as positive guidelines for developing a happy and successful Christian home.

Gospels (BS306)

With a focus on the Gospel of John, this course will provide a chronological overview of the life of Christ and a comparison of each of the four New Testament Gospels..

Bible Prophecy (TH402)

A study of Bible prophecy; this course will examine the things to come regarding the present age, various theories about the tribulation, the return of Christ, the millennial kingdom, the judgments, the new heavens and earth, etc.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

The Servant Leader (LD560)

The foundation of servant leadership is deeply-rooted in Scripture and modeled by Jesus Christ and early church leaders. This course will discover and examine Biblical principles of leadership in comparison to both traditional and contemporary secular leadership theory and skills. Emphasis will be placed upon Scriptural integrity in effectively critiquing leadership roles, as well as the influence of secular leadership models upon traditional and contemporary ministry.

Applied Theology (TH507)

A study of the practice of theology; this course will examine the theology and practice of the believer's personal encounter and relationship with God.

DOCTORAL LEVEL COURSES (Special 12 Week Session)

Systematic Theology (TH603) *DOCTORAL COURSE: 12 Week Session*****

An examination of the doctrines of Bibliology, Theology Proper, Christology, Soteriology, Pneumatology, Angelology, and Eschatology.

WINTER 2020: TERM B (January 27 – March 8)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

A Study of James (BS106)

James is one of the most direct and practical writers of the New Testament, providing a valuable understanding of the problems facing many of the early Jewish believers. This detailed and in-depth study will explore the background, purpose, and practical application of this powerful and interesting book, and will leave the student with a renewed faith in our Lord.

Abiding in the Spirit (LD350)

This course will examine the relationship of the Holy Spirit to the believer, which Christ promised to all believers (John 14:16). Emphasis will be given to the significance of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and a deep abiding fellowship with God.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

Theology of Man (TH503)

This course will examine the doctrine of man: Origin, nature, purpose, and destiny. Particular attention will be given to the fall of man and salvation through the finished work of Christ.

Living in the Spirit (LD550)

It is as the believer abides in Christ that the Holy Spirit resides within, close personal fellowship and intimacy with Christ is experienced, and anointed leadership occurs. This course will encourage students to seek to know the Holy Spirit and to enjoy His indwelling presence.

WINTER 2020: TERM C (February 24 – April 5)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

Biblical Principles of Leadership I (PM101)

A study of the biblical principles of leadership as revealed in the Word of God. We will discover the importance of integrity in character and ministry, being led by the Spirit, and walking in the fullness of your calling.

The Attributes of God (TH329) *NEW COURSE*****

God is awesome and unfathomable, and although it is impossible for finite man to fully comprehend everything about Him, Scripture is filled with knowledge of God, much of which is revealed in His numerous attributes. This study will explore many of these attributes, which will assist the student in knowing God in a deep and more meaningful way.

Comparative Religions (PH401)

An exploration of some of the various religions of the world, including pseudo-Christian cults, the occult and mystical religions, and other religions not related to Christianity. Discussion will include certain key teachings of each religion discussed, as well as the particular strategies and methods used in appeal, solicitation, and recruitment.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

A Study of God: Knowledge of the Holy (TH549) *NEW COURSE*****

Introduction to the doctrine God: This course will examine the nature and existence of God, with particular emphasis on the attributes of God.

World Religions (PH501)

This study will provide a brief introduction to the various religious beliefs held by many around the world, providing a basis for Christian believers to better know how to defend their faith and to witness truth to the lost.

WINTER 2020: TERM D (March 16 – April 26)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

Church History (TH104)

An exploration of the history of the Christian church. Discussion will include the early development of the church, great revivals and movements, and many important historical events as pertaining to the church.

Marriage & Family II (PM301) **no prerequisites required**

This course will include a practical, in-depth study of Biblical guidelines for the relationship between the husband and wife. Upon completion, students should better understand God's design for the intimate relationship within marriage and its effect upon establishing a healthy Christian home.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

The Spiritual Leader (LD509)

An exploration of Biblical guidelines for leadership, emphasizing the importance of being led by the Spirit and walking in close fellowship with God. Special emphasis will be placed on the character and integrity of a leader in the body of Christ, as well as guidelines for personal growth and development.

Biblical Dynamics of Marriage (PM517)

This course will include a practical, in-depth study of biblical guidelines for relationships between husbands and wives.
