SPRING 2019: TERM A (April 15 – May 26)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

Great Bible Doctrines (BS102)

The principles of the faith will be examined in this course as we examine in depth the major doctrines of the Bible. Essential doctrines such as the doctrine of God, the Scriptures, the finished work of Christ, the Holy Spirit, eschatology, and many more will be studied in detail.

Competent to Lead (LD401)

This course will explore Biblical guidelines for leadership, the qualifications of spiritual leaders, and the importance of being led by the Spirit and walking in close fellowship with God. It will examine the lives of several leaders throughout the Bible, studying both their successes and failures, and understanding the importance of genuine character in the men and women whom God will raise up to fulfill His call today.

Theology II: Our Salvation (TH401)

Soteriology: This course will cover salvation as it is considered from man's need, God's provision for reaching out to man, and the application of the work of God in salvation.

Masters Level Courses

Christ in the Seven Feasts (TH537)

This course will provide an exploration of the seven Feasts of the Lord (Leviticus 23:1-44), and their fulfillment in Jesus Christ. Emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament fulfillment.

The Competent Leader (LD501)

Seeking to recognize and establish clear principles of Biblical leadership as revealed in Scripture, special emphasis will be placed on the integrity of the spiritual leader, as well as guidelines for spiritual growth. This course will seek to establish the importance of walking in intimacy with God and the necessity of being led by the Spirit in exercising the call of God.

SPRING 2019: TERM B (April 29 – June 9)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

The Pauline Epistles (BS202)

A study of the Letters of Paul. Emphasis will be upon the background and purpose of each book, as well as the practical aspect of each. This study will examine the problems these epistles seek to correct, examining the methods used and how each book applies to us today.

Spiritual Warfare (TH425) NEW ONLINE COURSE

This course will examine the origin, nature, and extent of spiritual warfare. Beginning with the fall of angels and extending through the current spiritual conflict against mankind and the kingdom of God, this course will seek to provide an awareness of the conflict, as well as a good understanding of the believer's authority in the spirit-world.

Masters Level Courses

Spiritual Leadership (LD509)

Following Scriptural mandate and examples, this course will examine the nature of Biblical spiritual leadership, focusing on both the spiritual core of the individual leader, as well as leadership form and effectiveness. Through ongoing spiritual renewal, leaders lead under the direction and guidance of the Holy Spirit and have tremendous impact on the body of Christ.

Pulling Down Strongholds (TH525) NEW ONLINE COURSE

An understanding of the supernatural world and spiritual conflict is a broad subject and should be a part of any study of systematic theology. Paul declared that believers are engaged in a spiritual battle; wrestling "not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" (Ephesians 6:12). In order for the church to remain healthy and effective, it is imperative that we are aware of the conflict, as well as the tremendous resources available to us in Jesus Christ, which will assure us of victory in His name.

SPRING 2019: TERM C (May 13 – June 23)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

Introduction to Christian Counseling (CC205)

An introduction to the basic principles and techniques of Biblical counseling and its application to the ministry of Christian workers. This course will examine basic Biblical foundations for effective Christian ministry.

Personal Spiritual Development (PM306)

This course provides an in-depth, direct study concerning the personal spiritual development of the believer as revealed in the Word of God. Close attention is given to commitment, dedication, and personal holiness in lifestyle and conduct. Students will learn the importance of a life of intimacy with God.

A Study of Romans (BS304)

An analytical and expository study of the book of Romans. Special emphasis will be placed upon the historical content of the book, its purpose and doctrinal themes, as well as its practical application in the lives of believers today.

Masters Level Courses

Eschatology: The Book of Revelation (TH504)

A study of Bible prophecy; this course will examine the things to come regarding the present age, various theories about the tribulation, the return of Christ, the millennial kingdom, the judgments, the new heavens and earth, etc.

Walking Closely With God (PM516)

This study will examine the essentials of personal spiritual development and walking closely with God. Exploring the life and ministry of the prophet Elijah and using his experiences as example of what it means to walk closely with God, the student will discover personal commitment, dedication, holiness, and a life of intimacy with God himself.

SPRING 2019: TERM D (May 27- July 7)

Associate-Bachelor Level Courses

The Pastoral Epistles: 1-2 Timothy, Titus (BS201)

This study of the Pastoral Epistles will provide an understanding of New Testament leadership and church government. Particular attention will be given to the 5-fold ministry, and their relationship and calling to the body of Christ.

A Study of Ezra, Nehemiah, & Esther (BS405)

This course will discover the sovereign providence of God at work in the lives of the returning exiles. We will examine both the lives of Ezra and Nehemiah, as they labor relentlessly in the rebuilding of the temple and the walls of Jerusalem, and then in the spiritual renewal of the people of God. Upon completion, students should have a better understanding and grasp of the context and themes of the Old Testament books of Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther.

Masters Level Courses

Angelology (TH595)

An exploration of the origin, purpose, and ministry of angels. This study will also reveal the fall of angels, who is the devil, where did the demons come from, and the battle that rages today in the spirit-world.

Historical Books II (BS505)

This course will examine the writer, the date and time of the writing, and the theme and purpose of the books of Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther.
