**SPRING 2018: TERM A (April 9 - May 20)**

**Associate-Bachelor Level Courses**

**Life of Christ I (BS105)**

A fascinating study of the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, the Messiah, as seen in the Word of God. Particular emphasis will be given to Old Testament prophecies concerning Christ, His birth, and ministry.

**Comparative Religions (PH401) \*\* NEW COURSE \*\***

An exploration of some of the various religions of the world, including pseudo-Christian cults, the occult and mystical religions, and other religions not related to Christianity. Discussion will include certain key teachings of each religion discussed, as well as the particular strategies and methods used in appeal, solicitation, and recruitment.

**Masters Level Courses**

**The General Epistles (BS501)**

A study of the General Epistles: Hebrews, James, 1-2 Peter, 1-3 John, and Jude. Emphasis will be upon the background and purpose of each book, as well as the practical aspect of each. This study will examine the problems these epistles seek to correct, examining the methods used and how each book applies to us today.

**World Religions (PH501) \*\* NEW 12 WEEK COURSE \*\***

This study will provide a brief introduction to the various religious beliefs held by many around the world, providing a basis for Christian believers to better know how to defend their faith and to witness truth to the lost.

**SPRING 2018: TERM B (April 30 - June 10)**

**Associate-Bachelor Level Courses**

**New Testament Survey (BS101)**

A study covering the time from the close of the Old Testament through the Revelation. This course is designed to give the student a working knowledge of the background of the New Testament, surveying content as well as the historical setting of each book of the New Testament.

**American Church History (TH403)**

An exploration of the history, growth, and development of the church in America from the first American colony to the present day. Special emphasis will be given to American Puritanism, great revivals and movements during the late nineteenth and twentieth centuries.

**Abiding in the Spirit (LD350) NEW ONLINE COURSE**

This course will examine the relationship of the Holy Spirit to the believer, which Christ promised to all believers (John 14:16). Emphasis will be given to the significance of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and a deep abiding fellowship with God.

**Masters Level Courses**

**Historical Books II: Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther (BS505) (No Prerequisite)**

This course will examine the writer, the date and time of the writing, and the theme and purpose of the books of Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther.

**Living in the Spirit (LD550) NEW ONLINE COURSE**

It is as the believer abides in Christ that the Holy Spirit resides within, close personal fellowship and intimacy with Christ is experienced, and anointed leadership occurs. This course will encourage students to seek to know the Holy Spirit and to enjoy His indwelling presence.

**SPRING 2018: TERM C (May 29 - July 8)**

**Associate-Bachelor Level Courses**

**A Study of Hebrews (BS103)**

This in-depth study of one of the most powerful letters in the Bible will reveal much about our relationship with God as we discover Jesus Christ our Great High Priest.

**Major Prophets II: Ezekiel & Daniel (BS402) (No Prerequisite) NEW ONLINE COURSE**

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of Ezekiel and Daniel. This study will examine the writer, the theme and purpose of the writings, as well as the methods of ministry.

**Masters Level Courses**

**Theology of Man (TH503)**

The Doctrine of Man: This course will examine the doctrine of man; his origin, nature, purpose, and destiny.

**Introduction to Typology (TH509)**

This study will examine Old Testament types and shadows and their corresponding meaning and fulfillment in the New Covenant, providing a vivid revelation of Christ and his finished work.

**SPRING 2018: TERM D (June 18 – July 29)**

**Associate-Bachelor Level Courses**

**The Dynamics of the Holy Spirit (TH101)**

Pneumatology: A Biblical examination of the person, work, gifts, and ministry of the Holy Spirit. Special emphasis is placed on the ministry of the Holy Spirit today.

**Spiritual Leadership (LD409)**

Following Scriptural mandate and examples, this course will examine the nature of Biblical spiritual leadership, focusing on both the spiritual core of the individual leader, as well as leadership form and effectiveness. Through ongoing personal spiritual renewal, the leader leads under the direction and guidance of the Holy Spirit and has tremendous impact on the body of Christ.

**God's Plan For Man (TH303)**

Anthropology: This course will examine and outline in detail God's plan for man, beginning with the creation, the development and fall of man, as well as God's detailed plan for man's restoration. This course will provide an overview of God's eternal plan for the ages concerning man and the earth.

**Masters Level Courses**

**The Spiritual Leader (LD509)**

An exploration of Biblical guidelines for leadership, emphasizing the importance of being led by the Spirit and walking in close fellowship with God. Special emphasis will be placed on the character and integrity of a leader in the body of Christ, as well as guidelines for personal growth and development.

**Dispensational Theology: God's Plan of the Ages (TH524)**

Dispensational Theology: A study of ages, covenants, and dispensations, outlining and exploring the metanarrative of God's plan throughout Scripture.
